Bloody Rieting in Belfast.

Brifast, Ireland, June 10.—The people here have been wrought to a state of excilement by their ripebut demonstrations of Orangemen during the past two days. All work is stopped, the stores are closed and many residences are closely barricaded. Mobs are in every street, prepared for other deeds of violence. The Orangemen are greatly incensed at the constabiliary for firing upon them and threaten to attack their barracks. Describence of coldiers and police from Dublin and other cities are being forwarded to Belfast so assist the authorities in resping order. At mide night a mob of Orangemen raided a public house kept by O'Haral and after sacking it set is on fire. The police charged the rioters a dozen times with bayoness bat each time were forced back by volleys of stones. The police were finally forced to take refuge in the barracks, where they fired lupon the mob from the second story windows. The mob, however, held their ground twenty minutes lenger, although the firing of the police was heavy and incessant. Scores of rictors were wounded and it is known positively that six men and two women were killed. A great many wounded persons were carried away by friends, and whether their injuries are fatal is not known. Twenty of the rioters who recaived builted wounds are lying in one infirmary. A large number of Orangemen who took part in the riot were arrected today. The inquest over the bodies of these killed will be opened this afternoon.
