### OUR PROGRESS AS A NATION.

Andrew Carnegie emigrated from Scotland to this country with a boy. Starting with nothing, by industry and intelligence he has accumulated a vast fortune as a manufacturer of steel. This gentleman has recently published a book entitled "Triumphant Democracy." It is a history of the marvelous material prosperity of the United States, and is a work every young American should read, for nowhere else can be found so many facts showing the wonderful industrial development of our country, and the possibilities of its still more wonderful future. The work is so elogetic of our institutions that it could not very well have been written by an American, but coming from a Scotchman it is not open to the charge of "spread-eagleism." Mr. Carnegie's object seems to have been to impress the Scotch and English people with the superiority of a democratic over an aristocratic or a monarchical form of government. If this work could get into the hands of the common people of Great Britain it would wean many of them from monarchical institutions and make them help hasten the day when the privileged classes would be asked to step down and out. However, this change of feeling is taking place anyway, as the result of tendencies inherent in the institutions of the old country.
