Graded Schools.

The General Assembly of North Caro-

SECTION 1. That section 1st of chapter 117 of the Laws of 1883 be amend u by striking out in line three (3): "At the next regular election of councilmen. and inserting in lieu thereof the words, At the regular election of councilmen, on the first Monday in May, 1887.

SEC. 2. That section 2d, of said chaptee, be amended by striking out the words, in lines 15, 16 and 17, "one third of one per centum," and "one dollar on the poll, and inserting in lieu thereof, "one-fifth of one per centum, and "sixty cents on the poll."

SEC. 3. That sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8. be stricken out.

SEC. 4. That the special taxes thus erest of the people they will not levied and collected shall be expended in keeping up separate graded schools for the white and colored children in said city of New Berne, between the ages of six and twenty-one years, and schools for each race herein vided for shall have the same length of echool terms.

SEC. 5. That the trustees of the New Berne Academy shall constitute the board of trustees for said schools; and
