EDITOR JOURNAL:- New Berne, North Carolina was first settled in the year 1711, one hundred and seventy-siz years ago, and in all the time that has elapsed since then, there has not been two hundred consecutive vards of first-class sidewalks constructed in the entire city. We honestly think that we have the most sidewalks of any town of like size in the United States. There are bouldfour inches high running across them. and loose stone and brickbats laying in the streets and on the sidewalks to bal last one of the Clyde steamers. LEXINGTON, June 22.-Information just received in Lexington, Ky., from a reliable source, says a terrible state of county seat. The friends of the murdered Martin and of the butchered Logan boys who lived in the upper edge of the county and also in the adjoining county, have formed themselves nto a band of regulators, and propose to wreak summary vengence on Craig Tolliver and his blood-thirsty hench-

men. Tolliver has received several notes warning him that the town of Morehead would be burned and the people slaughtered. Consequently every citizen in Morehead goes armed, and sleeps on his arms at night. The women scarcely sleep at all, fearing the coming of the mob. Last Friday night was set to burn the town, but the place was guarded so well that the though made, was abandoned. An intense feeling of insecurity prevails. Business is entirely abandoned, and a fresh and bloody outbreak may be ex pected at any time.

John Belliter and James Frakes, liv ing in the eastern part of Flemming county, near the Rowan county line bought farms there lately. On yesterday they were set upon by a gang of outlaws supposed to be Tolliver friends. Belliter and Frakes were told to leave and they did so, abandening their crops. From all reports there is a general state of terrorization throughout Rowan. The county officials are controlled by Talliver guns.
