The corporate name of the said associatson shall be "The New Berne Homestead Building Associa-tion." The said association is formed for the purpose of accumulating, by small periodical deposits, a savings fund with which the members thereof may Direct importation of French secure a homestead, and for their mutual benefit and for the purpose of holding, purchasing and disposing of real estate and personal property.

The capital stock of said association shall consist of not less than three hundred nor more than five thousand shares, the par value of each share shall be one hundred dollars, and no member shall be allowed to hold more than twenty-five shares of capital stock at any one time.

Every member shall, upon entering at the formation of the association or before each regular monthly meeting own, until the association shall cease and determine, or his connection therewith shall cease by the transfer of his stock or otherwise.
