The State Fair.

We gladly note that the management
of the State Fair concluded to hold
over Saturday, making it five instead
of four days as usual. On Tuesday,
the opening day, it rained a great deal
and made it so disagreeable that but
few were in attendance and the pro-
gram of opening was postponed till the
next day. This was done by President
Upchurch in a few well chosen words
of welcome to the crowd and tendering
them free access to the grounds. An
address was then delivered by His Ex-
cellency the Governor, in which he
spoke mainly of the history of the State
agricultural society since its organiza-
tion in 1858 and the general prosperity
of North Carolina and its bright future.
Senator Hanson being present was
called on. He said but little, but that
was well received. The crowd Wednes-
day was not very large, but many more
came Thursday.

Most of the exhibits show to good
effect, but are not as varied as a few
years back that is in the line of me-
chanical ingenuity steam engines,
farming implements, etc. Also there
is lacking the fine horse flesh that
was seen there a few years back. It may be
that they are kept in stable on account
of the wet weather. The display of fine
cattle, hogs, sheep and poultry is
good.

In Central Hall the exhibits are fine
and do credit to the owners. This build-
ing is crowded most of the time because
there are so many attractive articles to
be seen and examined. In musical
merchandise there is the grandest dis-
play ever made there, and to add to the
enjoyment, performers have been en-
gaged to play upon them among which
is a lady paragon of wonderful talent.

Also in different departments there
are handsome displays of art—the
handwork of our State. Portrait paint-
ing in oil, crayon and china work is ex-
cellent. Splendid and artistic needle
work and pottery, etc., abound. Some-
what of the same character, harness
and saddlery, breads and cakes, fruits,
vegetables and grain make a good ex-
hibit. The Durham tobacco display
excites much admiration. The floral
display is beautiful. One of the best
exhibits there, and one that is of great
importance to North Carolina, is the
great variety of woods and minerals.
They are a credit to the fair. A fine
display of vehicles can also be seen.

Among other exhibits from the East we
notice the patent chair swing invented
by Geo. Fisher, col., of New Berne, in
operation. He has also on hand work
from his blacksmith shop that attracts
attention. There are other things here
well worthy of mention but our stay
was too short to go into details. We
have seen no gaming tables or gambling
of any description going on inside the
grounds. That speaks well. On ac-
count of bad weather making a heavy
track, no racing took place Tuesday,
Wednesday nor Thursday. This caused
much disappointment.

It is hoped that better weather
prevailed Friday and Saturday. The
marshals have been quite efficient in
their duties and good order was main-
tained. A sad accident (the first fatal
one since the organization of the Fair)
occurred Wednesday afternoon. A
man by the name of Berry Taylor from
Snow Hill, Green county, was standing
between the tracks of the N. C. R. and
the R. & O. R. just outside the grounds
when a train on each track going in op-
posite directions went speeding by. He
became confused and stood too near the
half-hour running between the grounds
and the city. It struck him and
knocked him under the wheels, four
cars passing over him, badly mutilating
his body. Though physicians were
quickly summoned, the unfortunate
lingered but a few hours.

J. J. Westbrook induced him to do so.
