Boxing the Ears. Dr. Samsel Sexton says, on the subject of boxing the ears, he has upon his records fifty-one cases in which the ear has been injured by blows of the hand or fist. Of these thirty one were males and twenty females. Of the males thirteen had been boxed upon the right ear, thirteen upon the left and three upon both ears. One was kicked by a companion upon the left ear while bathing, and the right ear of another was injured by having the head violently squeezed between the hands of another person. Of the females fourteen were struck upon the left ear and six upon the right. Five of the woman were assualted by their hushands.
