The Pressure on Gov. Ogleshy, SPRINGFIELD, LLL., Nov. 6 - Gov. Og esby's mail in the anarchist case was larger this morning than ever before. Ninety-seven letters and communications were received by the executive messenger from the postoffice window and of this number fully eight per cent related to the anarchist case. The greater part of these were from Chicago and Gov. Ogleaby this afternoon informed the Associated Press representative that while there were many demands that the sentence of death be carried out, the proportion of requests for commutation was decidedly larger than on any previous day. As a matter of fact, said the Governor, the pleas for clemency have always been somewhat greater than the requests for non-inter-ference, but this morning the proportion was somewhat greater than usual. It is said that the Governor is at the time receiving communications from an un-usually large number of the moneyed men of the country, who recommend commutation of sentence. Some of these gentlemen waive all questions as to the law and justice of the case and simply favor elementy on the grounds of public policy, insisting that it is bet-tor to rend the condemned men to the punitentiary for life than it is to allow
