SOUTHERN RAPINES

It is now well known that the Southern Baptists convened on May 11th, in an annual session, in the First Baptist Church, and it was voted to order a Free State of the U. S. in Missouri, if they pass not the Rev. Dr. P. H. Morris' proposition, during the last Convention. Prof. Dr. Dr. made a few touching remarks in regard to the deceased president, after which Rev. Dr. J. H. Bowles, of Newark, offered a prayer, and Dr. Wm. G. George, of Columbia, R. I., responded in a few words.

On the following day, Prof. Dr. Dr. made a few remarks, and the following delegations were present: from Alabama, Arkansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Indiana, Georgia, South Carolina, Maryland, Massachusetts, North Carolina, South Carolina, North Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia, and others.

President Long visited him at Dr. J. E. Pease, Kentucky.

Also Presidents Lewis, of Elizabethton, Missouri; Rev. John Pollard, of Richmond; Rev. J. B. Hawthorne, of Atlanta; Judge Jonathan Harrison, of Selma.

Secretaries H. Lansing Burrows, of Augusta, and Oliver P. Gregory, of Baltimore.

Regular committees on the order of business and religious observance were then appointed.

The report of the Home Mission Board showed that the treasurer had received \$88,881 and disbursed \$84,000. The board, in making official announcement of the death of March 1st, of Rev. M. T. Yates, D. D., missionary to China, pays a glowing tribute to his worth and works in the missionary field, and presents to the Convention the following resolution:

Resolved, That in the death of the late Rev. Matthew T. Yates, D. D., the Southern Baptist Convention has lost one of its oldest, most steadfast and efficient missionaries; China its most enlightened and philanthropic adopted citizen, and the Christian world a man and servant of God, whose life and character were an honor to his race, and whose death is a loss to mankind.

Resolved, That in honor to the memory of our noble dead, and in justice to our own sentiments of gratitude and grief, a call should be made for a company of our best qualified young ministers to reinforce our reduced forces in Central, Southern and Northern China, as a "Yates Memorial Band."

The Convention sermon, preached tonight by Rev. F. M. Ellis, of Baltimore, was a remarkable dissertation on the subject of Christian giving; his presentation of the character of liberality as outlined in the Scriptures, was interesting in the extreme. He contended that the tithe laws of the Jews had never been abrogated, and that the prevailing Christian methods are out of harmony with God's law governing liberality. His arguments were received with apparent approval by an immense audience, many hundreds standing throughout the discourse, which occupied an hour and a half.

The impression prevails that the sermon is intended to pave the way for the adoption of new methods in pressing missionary endeavor. The rapid succession of incisive epigrammatic sentences delivered with plain yet eloquent oratory insured an attentive bearing to the close. The sermon was followed by the announcement of the Committee on Home Mission Work, and this consumed the evening session.
