Resolved, That in the death of the late Rev. Matthew T. Yates, D. D., the Southern Baptist Convention has lost one of its oldest, most steadfast and efficient missionaries; China its most enlightened and philanthropic adopted citizen, and the Christian world a man and servant of God, whose life and character were an honor to his race, and whose death is a loss to mankind.

Resolved, That in honor to the memory of our noble dead, and in justice to our own sentiments of gratitude and grief, a call should be made for a company of our best qualified young ministers to reinforce our reduced forces in Central, Southern and Northern China, as a "Yates Memorial Band."

The Convention sermon, preached tonight by Rev. F. M. Ellis, of Baltimore, was a remarkable dissertation on the subject of Christian giving; his presentation of the character of liberality as outlined in the Scriptures, was interesting in the extreme. He contended that the title laws of the Jews had never been abrogated, and that the prevailing Christian methods are out of harmony with God's law governing liberality. His arguments were received with apparent approval by an immense audience, many hundreds standing throughout the discourse, which occupied an hour and a half.

The impression prevails that the sermon is intended to pave the way for the adoption of new methods in pressing missionary endeavor. The rapid succession of incisive epigrammatic sentences delivered with plain yet eloquent oratory insured an attentive hearing to the close. The sermon was followed by the announcement of the Committee on Home Mission Work, and this consumed the evening session.
