Delicate Weighing Machines.

The writer drifted into the shop of a scale manufacturer a few days ago, and after inspecting a hundred different varieties of weighing machihes, ranging from those which will indicate the weight of a locomotive or a car loaded with 75,000 pounds of freight down to a liliputian, toylike affair small enough to be carried in the pocket, he remarked, as he axamined a pair of fairy scales under a glass case: "I suppose these are the frailest balances made.

"Oh, no; here is something still more delicate," replied the scale man, bringing forth another tiny machine, more diminutive than first "This," said the manufacturer, "is the most sensitive weighing machine yet invented. Nothing smaller in the shape of a scale has chines, ranging from those which

smaller in the shape of a scale has ever been made. This is the machine which gives the exact weight of a single single hair, or an eyelash. You can find out the weight of your signature with it. What! You, too, are skepticale. Then I will convince you. Here is a slip of paper. It weighs just thirty-nine milligrammes. A milligramme is the one-thousanth part of a gramme and a gramm is equal to fifteen Now, just write your name upon it with this lead pencil."

The writer scrawled the name his parents gave him on the scrap of paper, and handed it back to the proprietor, who placed it on the tiny scales, and adjusting the weightswhich were no bigger than the head of a large sized pin-found the signature to weigh exactly six millgrammes.

"No, there is not a very great demand for these scales," said the manufacturer, "although they are very popular among the money brok ers and are used largely for assaying purposes. The last one sold was yesterday afternoon. It was bought realthy autograph collector, who purposes weighing the signatures of famous people with the intention of publishing, in pamphlet form, the result of his labors, and I suppose we may expect to be inflicted with the book before long.
