JACKSONVILLE, Oct. 5 - The weather continues warm. The situation remains unchanged, except perhaps that cases of fever are generally of a milder type. Dr. B. C. Nuez Villavicencio, an expounder of the inoculation theory, is somewhat piqued that the Board of Health will not permit him to perform an autopey on a yellow fever victim, in order to secure virus for inoculation. Dr. Neal Mitchell, President of the Board of Health, issues the following official bulletin for the twenty-four hours ending at 6 p. m. New cases 52, deaths 6. Total cases, 3,022; total

deaths 277. Of the new cases fifteen are white and thirty seven are colored.
