Singular Properties of the Figure Nine.
Multiply 9 by itself, or by any other single figure, and the two figures forming the product will, in each case, if added together, amount to 9. For example, 9 multiplied by 9 is 81, and 8 and 1 added together make 9; so on with the other figures. The figures 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9, added together make 45, and these two figures will, if added together, make 9. The amount of the several products or multiples of 9 (9, 18, 27, 36, 45, 54, 63, 72, 81), namely, 405, and the figures forming either the dividend or the quotient, added together, make 9. Multiply any row of figures either by 9, or by any one of the products of 9, multiplied by a single figure, as by 18, 27, 36, 45, 54, 63, 72 or 81, and the sum of the figures of the product, added together, will be divisible by 9.
Multiply the 9 digits in the following order—1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9, by 9, or by any one of the products of 9 mentioned in the last sentence, and the products will come out all in one figure, except the place of tens, which will be a 0, and that figure will be the one which, multiplied into 9, supplies the multiplier; that is, if you select 9 as the multiplier, the product will be (except the place of tens) all ones; if you select 18, all twos; if 27, all threes; and so on. Omit the 8 in the multiplicands, and the 0 will also vanish in the product, leaving it all ones, twos and threes, etc., as the case may be.

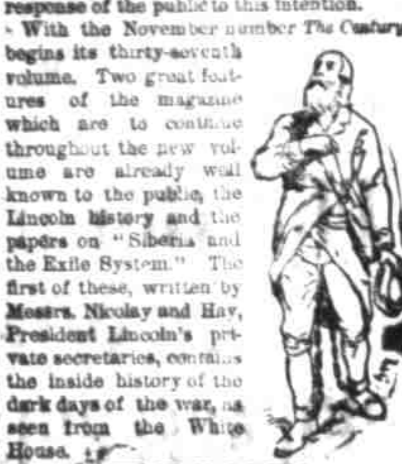
