**Treasurer Back to Sheriffs and Tax Collectors.**

NORTH CAROLINA. TREASURY DEPARTMENT. Raleigh, Feb. 5, 1889.

To Sheriffs and Tax Collectors of North Carolina.

The following act of the General Assembly is published for your information and guidance. It is in force and effect from and after the 1st day of February, 1889, and applies to the sale of property for taxes for the year 1888.

The General Assembly of North Carolina.

SECTION 1. That section fifty-five chapter one hundred and thirty-seven laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, be and the same is hereby amended by striking out the word "February" in the first line of said section, and inserting "May" and amend section one hundred and thirty-seven of the said act, so that the same shall read as follows: "The sheriff of each county shall, on or before the first day of May in each year, publish in the official gazette of the county, a list of the lands in the county which are subject to sale for taxes, and the amount of the taxes due thereon."

Sec. 2. Strike out section one hundred and thirty-eight of the said act, and insert "April" in the first line of said section, and amend section one hundred and thirty-eight of the said act, so that the same shall read as follows: "The sheriff of each county shall, on or before the first day of April in each year, publish in the official gazette of the county, a list of the lands in the county which are subject to sale for taxes, and the amount of the taxes due thereon."

Sec. 3.
