Jones County Items.

The wet weather continues. The whortleberry crop is fine and is ripening. Farmers are near all complaining of the potato bugs.

Mrs. M. O. Giddens, who has been critically sick for some weeks, we are glad to learn, is now much better. The farmers say that their Irish potatoes are large, but very few to the vine.

Notwithstanding the depredation of the hawks, the crop of spring chickens is pretty fair. Corn in places is drowned. Many of our farmers have had to plant their swamp lands over again.

We have heard of but two real fine gardens in our whole section, L. H. Mallard's and M. O. Giddens'. There are but few partridges this spring in this vicinity. The sportsmen and hawks have nearly captured them all.

The farmers are so busy fighting the grass that they actually don't have time to visit Trenton even on Saturday evenings. Many of the newspapers say that the fruit trees are loaded with fruit.

There has been a large quantity of hay shipped to Jones county this summer, yet there has been any quantity of crab grass hay that could have been saved last fall which would have been much better and more nutritious than much of this hay that I have seen the farmers hauling around.

Old Meal for Cattle.

The superior excellence of this food has been recently shown in England in an experiment of fattening cattle at Woburn, on the estate of the Duke of Bedford.

Examining the carcasses after slaughter, the meat of the beasts whose rations contained a moderate proportion of old meal was found to be riper than that of those fed without a mixture of old meal, and of a superior quality.
