Richlands Items.
 We made poor crops this year, but hog killing time has come and we are satisfied now.

Ginning season is about over and the cotton all sold. There was 470 bales ginned last year and 250 bales this year at Richlands, a fall of 200 bales.

Though we have short crops, our young people continue to marry. I was at the marriage of Mr. Rich and G. Huffman and Miss Susie Taylor, on December 11. Those in attendance were Mr. Geo. Barbee and Miss Emma Rhodes, Mr. A. B. Cox and Miss Sallie Rhodes, E. L. Francks, Esq., officiated. The friends of Mr. Huffman gave him a serenade that night. This has grown to be a custom on Hominy swamp. The serenaders, about fifty in the band, were led by Wm. Cavanaugh. They were dressed in all kinds of costumes and each man had his instrument, which was either a fiddle, accordeon, harp, tin pan, coffee pot, cow bells, tamborine, conchs, or horns of some description. They carried a lantern on a long stick to guide them. As they approached the great discord of sounds struck horror to all the canine race, and they immediately fled to the woods. The musicians marched around the house two or three times and then halted in the front yard. I was struck with some of the characters: Sallie Ann, Jim Johnson and Racking Bill. Eli was there, too, with his "tinke, tinke, tinke." They sang several pieces and closed with a sacred piece, "The Victory Won." These are a good and prosperous people, they do their own work and depend on no one else.
