THE STEAMER CLEOPATRA.

District of Pamlico.

Whereas, a libel hath been filed in the District Court of the United States of America for the District of Pamlico, on the 10th day of January, A.D. 1880, by John L. Jones, L. Roberson, and Chas. Brown vs. The Steamer Cleopatra, for seamen's wages and paying the usual process and motion of the court, that all persons interested in the said vessel, her tackle, apparel and furniture, may be directed to pay over to the court all due process, showing that the same may be decreed to be sold, and the proceeds thereof be distributed according to law. Therefore, in pursuance of the said motion under the seal of said court, to me directed and delivered, I do hereby give notice to all concerned, or pretending to have any right, title or interest therein, and to master of the said Cleopatra, in special, to appear before the aforesaid court, at the city of New Bern, on the 13th day of February, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to answer the said libel, and to make payment, if any, in the said cause, also to appear unto all other persons having claims against the said vessel, for wages earned on board thereof, who may choose to make themselves parties to the libel of said steamer Cleopatra, by way of amendment or supplement, without further process.
