Life In Greenland.

From the narrative of the celebrated Dr. Nausen, who was the first explorer to cross Greenland, we take the following interesting

sketch of some of his experiences:

In the beginning of September, 1888, we reached a quite flat and extensive plateau, resembling a frozen ocean. Its height was between 8,000 and 9,000 feet. Over this plateau or highland we travelled more than two weeks. The cold was intense; on some nights it was between 80 and 90 Fahrenheit. During one month we found no water. To get drinking water we were obliged to melt snow either in our cooking appa ratus or by our own warmth in iron bottles, which were carried inside our bosoms.

To give a description of the region is easy. We saw only three things: these were snow, sun and our selves. One day was quite like another but still even this part of the earth has its beauties, and I shall never forget the glorious sun sets and the nights on the snowand lce-fields of Greenland, when the ever-changing northern lights were scintillating, perhaps, brighter than anywhere else. I shall never forget the strange impressions, as tarrh Cure.
