

The Chilean Uprising. A state of Anarchy exists.

LONDON, March 13.—A Buenos Ayres dispatch says that the family of Balmaceda are safe in the Argentine Republic. The latest advices from Santiago were to the effect that the city which had been maintained by severe martial law is beginning to be turbulent, owing to the reported success of the insurgents. An attempt to hold an election on last Sunday was a complete failure, only the government officials and employees taking part, the people generally holding aloof, convinced that the old regime in Chile is coming to an end. The insurgents continue to be abundantly supplied with money and pay for all provisions and private property taken by them.

**Terrible Experience of a Shipwrecked Crew.**

LONDON, March 13.—The unknown steamship which was reported lost off Start Point, on the southern coast of Devonshire on Monday last, it has been ascertained was the Miramal of Liverpool. The crew succeeded in launching two of the ship's boats and made a desperate effort to reach the shore, but to no avail. The boat which contained the officers and a number of men had proceeded but a short distance, when a tremendous sea swept over her, and she plunged beneath the waves with all on board. The remainder of the crew in the other boat made a fearful struggle to make the land. Once she was captured and, after a number of the men had been swept away, was righted by the survivors. A second time the boat went over with a like fatality and a similar result. Finally, after almost incredible suffering and wonderful endurance, four Swedish sailors succeeded in reaching the beach, where one of their number died from exhaustion.

**CUBA RIPE FOR RETOLT.**

Rumors in New York that an outbreak has already occurred.

NEW YORK, March 12. Rumors of an outbreak in Cuba reached here today. It is said that the dissatisfaction is widespread, and will not only include Havana, but Matanzas, Cienfuegos, and the most important parts of the island. At the office of J. E. Ward & Co. it was said that no cables received had any reference to the outbreak. Several Cubans in the city say that the time is ripe, but deny knowledge of any outbreak. Shipping circles are more or less excited over the report, which seems to have considerable basis.

**Poultry.**

The most beautiful, useful and popular of turkeys is the bronze variety. The gobler, when matured, should not weigh less than twenty-five pounds, and the hen sixteen pounds.
