

Investigating the Dictator Wreck Drink water Censured.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 15.-Lieutenant T. D. Walker. Assistant Inspector of the life saving service in his report of the wreck of the Norwegian bark Dictator, near Sea Tack Life Saving Station, Va., made to Superintendent Kimball, censures Keeper Ed. Drinkwater, in charge of the station, for failure to employ the life car for the rescue of the imperilled people. The Dictator was wrecked March 27th, and had on board 17 people, of whom seven were lost, including the captain,s wife and child.
