LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 22, 1891. ED. JOURNAL-The heirs of Robert Edwards are gathered in this city from every part of the United States and some from Canada, for the purpose of prosecuting their claims to the immense estate which is alleged to have been left. The estate consists of thirty-five acres of land in the heart of New York city, including in its center Old at \$3,000,000, or more.

It is claimed that one Robert Edwards leased, prior to the Revolutionary war. the land claimed by his deceadants, to some one, whose name is not men-tioned. Edwards died in England, leaving three brothers in this country as heirs to his estate. The first effort on the part of the heirs to reclaim the property was made thirteen years ago.
