**WHO IS TO MANAGE ELECTIONS.**  
 Is it to be Our Own People or Sheriff and Federal Supervisors?

It is enough to make a patriot's blood boil to survey what is passing here in North Carolina and all over the Union, wherever the Republican advantage is to be gained by calling in the arm of Federal power. In this country, the people are supposed to be the rulers. Our fathers fought for their independence, and we have inherited the blessing through their sufferings and trials and sacrifice. Among the liberties of the people is the right to govern themselves, free from the domination of lords and rulers, and an incident of government is the right to elect public officers. The right to elect belongs to the people, and the right to elect carries with it the right to hold the elections. All elections should therefore be held by the officers regularly chosen and appointed by the people for the purpose. This is the essence of our free government; not only to select public officers at public elections but to have the elections themselves held and conducted by persons regularly designated by the people.

Yet what do we see today. At various points in the Union, as here in the Eastern District of North Carolina, we see men appointed to hold the elections, with powers claimed to be superior to the powers derived from the people themselves—and appointed by one man! Such is the spectacle presented wherever the tyrannical, the unrepresentative Republican party deems that some partisan advantage can be secured to it by taking from the people the right to hold their own election. Thus we see in our dispatches that the United States Marshal in Alabama is asking the Attorney General at Washington if he can appoint as many deputies as he chooses in order to keep the peace in Mobile and Montgomery. Here a week before the election this officer is casting about for "efficient men to keep the peace!" The rascal is seeking for efficient men to stir up a riot. And thus in North Carolina as

well as elsewhere, supervisors of elections have been appointed to take charge of the elections—appointed by one man—appointed by sort of chief ruler of the people in the matter of elections—appointed by a sort of Lord and Maker of the free people of North Carolina. The people are not to manage their own election—one Col. Shaffer is to do it for them. And who is Col. Shaffer? What title has he to this eminence among the people, that he should be invested with the royal purple among us? He is not even native and to the manner born; yet to him is given the power to interfere with the elections of the people and to appoint men, whom he claims to invest with power to conduct and hold our elections.

It is this spectacle that we say is sufficient to make every patriotic heart burn with indignation, and the blood of patriots to boil in their veins. We cannot think with calmness upon such a subject: We cannot deal with it except in indignation. To this has the Republican party brought the people of this country. Let our people make their remonstrance at the polls. Let their voice thunder at the ballot-box. Let them put on record on election day their abhorrence and detestation of Federal Supervisors appointed by a partisan Commissioner to dominate our people at the polls.—News and Observer.

If there are 250,000 men in New York State who have had their wages raised by the McKinley bill, why is it that none of them can be found to acknowledge it? Can you see how your protectionist friend will wiggle to evade the question.
