The National Press convention which has just closed its session at St. Paul selected Atlanta as its place of meeting next year.

North Carolina is leading her sister Southern states in the effort to induce immigration through the agency of the World's fair.

This insult to Mr. Gladstone by the so-called aristocracy will make him all the dearer to the masses whose battles he has been fighting so valiantly and whose faith in him grows stronger the longer he lives.

Secretary Hoke Smith has reduced the expenses of the census bureau by \$6,000 a month. Secretary Gresham has dismissed a large number of incompetent and superfluous clerks. If things go on in this way we shall presently have the government paying only for what it gets in the way of service and exacting a competent and faithful service in return for salary, no matter how much pull a clerk may have or how necessary it may be to himself to "take care of him."

OBEEDIENCE TO LAW. The latest information from Washington is to the effect that the Chinese Exclusion law will be executed, and the World's Fair contract enforced. This is as it should be.

A few days ago it was reported that Secretary Gresham had said that "the law is a dead letter." The learned secretary says he made no such declaration, and Secretary Carlisle assures the public that the law will be executed, so far as his department is concerned. It is admitted that no adequate appropriation has been made for this purpose but it is believed that Congress will soon supply the deficiency. The Government must execute the law or Congress must repeal it.

We are also told that the World's Fair, at Chicago, will be closed on Sunday. It is so provided in the very terms of the contract by which the necessary funds for the great exposition were provided and an attempt to evade the contract is discredit to the party that makes it.

And here is the underlying principle that gives security to life, liberty and property. Without law there can be no Government. The country, in some sections, has been disgraced by lynchings. In what does lynch law find its apology? In the simple fact that criminals are not adequately punished by the courts. Criminal cases are shifted from term to term, and when a trial is eventually reach, it is too often the case that the guilty escape. It is important that municipal, and state laws be enforced for upon their observance depends personal rights and domestic security; and it is equally important that the authority of the General Government be maintained. The national honor must be preserved. A dishonored nation sullies the name of all its citizens.

If the Chinese Exclusion act is unjust and detrimental to the character of the nation, it can be amended or repealed. It should never be said of any law, municipal, state or national, that "it is a dead letter," so long as it remains on the statute book.

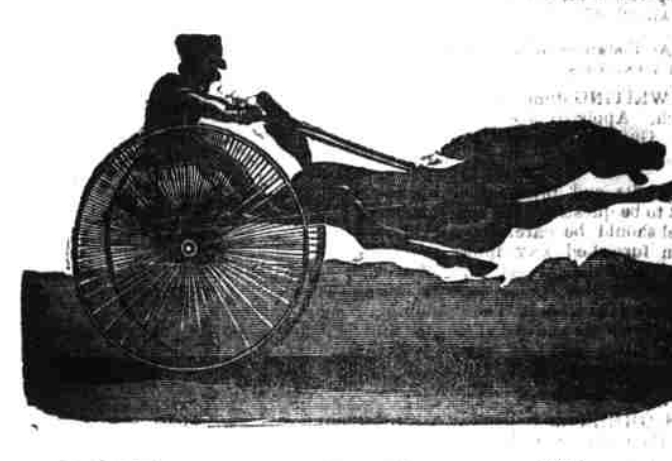
