As fast as possible, I have refunked all these advances and every member of the party is re paid, except a few persons whom I have not yet heard from. It has required time to ascertain the ounts due each one, and I have been very busy with a great variety of work connected with my official duties and my ordinary affairs.

This statement will, I hope, explain the matter to people who are willing to do justice.
