One Stump a Fat-Load.

In four item on the river and harbon improvement work we alluded to the big stumps at the bottom of Neuse river channel on which the steam hoister Contentnea and her force were at work when we visited the scene of operations The stump was being taken up in pieces, having been blasted and we left when only part of it had been taken out. Afterwards, overseer Durham called at our office and gave us the following addi tional facts in reference to it:

This one stump loaded the flat used to receive what is pulled up. The flut is 30 feet long and 10 feet wides this will give an idea of the stumps size.

The appearance of the top of the majority of these stumps seems to indicate that they were cut down, occasionally or appears to have been burnt off.
