THE TARIFF.

Senator Pugh was not far wrong when in a public address he declared that he knew nothing about the tariff. We do not mean that the Senator is an ignoramus, for he is one of the wisest of men and is at present the honored chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee.

A tariff bill is a restful of the custom duties to be paid on imported goods. It is almost infinite, in extent and variety, and of the millions of people in this country every one wants a tariff that will tend to promote his individual interests.

Mr. Wilson says it is a step in the right direction, giving some relief to the people without administering too great a shock to the industries of the country.
