It has already been reduced one hundred thousand dollars less, leaving only about forty six thousand dollars to be paid.

A New Bernian for the Alabama Legislature.

We note with pleasure the nomination of our former townsman, Captain Hamilton C. Graham, to represent the county of Dallas in the legislature of Alabama.

The childhood and youth of Captain Graham were passed in New Berne, whence he removed in the autumn of 1855 to settle in Alabama. He is a graduate of the University of Chapel Hill, and served throughout the late war—in which at the battle of Gaines Hill, he was severely wounded in various capacities from private Captain.

It will be remembered that Captain Graham delivered the address here on Memorial Day, 1885, his subject being his old Colonel J. Johnston Pettigrew. He is one of so many of our best citizens given to Alabama by North Carolina.
