LONDON'S GAS, An Anierican Who Has Achieved

Two young American engineers have lately succeeded in a long struggle with English conservatism, as evinced in the gas industry. Some years ago these two men, A. C. Humphreys and A. G. Glasgow, conceived the idea that the water-gas process, by which coal gas is enriched by a gas made from petro-leum and superheated steam, would prove economical in many English cities. So they resigned from the important positions they held in this country and went to London, where for a number of years they have been endeavoring to obtain a foothold. The prejudice against the process which they advocate has been overcome now to a considerable extent, and a number of works installed. It was some time before the value of the process was acknowledged, and even after that was edged, and even after that was throly satisfactory by your promptly is granted it was held that the price of funding the \$5.00 G W Gaskill. oil, six cents a gallen, was an in-superable obstacle. 
