

BEGINS LIFE TERM AT 14

Boy In Knee Pants Murdered Two Children And Woman. Joliet, Ill., June 13.—A boy in knee pants who looked like the average son of boys 12 to 13 years old and wearing the embarrassed grin of the lad who has been called in from play "to speak his piece for company," was received in the penitentiary here this morning to begin a life term for the recent murder of a woman and two babies.

The boy was Herman Coppes, 14 years old, who last April shot and killed Mrs. Mannie Sleep at her farm home in East Plato, near Elgin, and brained her two children, a boy of 2 years and a girl of 4.

He is the youngest life prisoner who has ever entered the State prison. Herman Coppes was given his first shave and first pair of long trousers. He appeared unconcerned and said to the officials: "I am glad to get here. This looks more interesting than the Kane county jail." He was placed in solitary confinement for today on bread and water. Just to what occupation he will be assigned has not been determined.
