**HELD A MATCH OVER GASOLENE**

**FLASH FOLLOWED AND DR. E. C. HARGETT'S AUTO WAS BADLY DAMAGED.**

An automobile owned by Dr. E. C. Hargett, city veterinarian and meat inspector, was badly damaged last night when some inquisitive person struck a match and ignited gas which was escaping from the machine as it was standing in front of the Athens cafe last night shortly after 9 o'clock.

Dr. Hargett had been having trouble with the machine and had left it alone while he went into the cafe to phone for a set of batteries. During the time that he was in the building some one struck a match, presumably for the purpose of looking at the engine, and immediately there was a flash. There was ten gallons of gasolene in the tank and if the blaze had reached this there is no telling what the result would have been. Fortunately the owner succeeded in getting a pan full of water and extinguishing the fire before it had reached the gasolene tank. In doing this, however, his hands were badly burned. The machine was damaged to an extent of about fifty dollars.

**BELL BOYS HAD EXTENSIVE LOOT**

**POLICE UNCOVER DENS IN WHICH STOLEN GOODS WERE CONCEALED.**

New York June 13.—Dark deeds of Harlem's "jimmy-the-door" bell-boys are coming to light. Close on the heels of the discovery of William Keene's \$18,000 loot den, detectives of the Lenox Avenue Police Station uncovered the hiding places of \$2,000 more in stolen clothing, silver and house furnishings.

Hatty Jones and Edward Lightburn negroes, elevator boy and bellboy, are held in connection with the new discovery. In Jones' room at 67 West One Hundred and Thirty-third street the detectives found loot which they valued at about \$1,500. The goods seized in Lightburn's "den" are worth about \$500. Two steel jimmies were taken in the raids.

The police say that the negroes arrested have confessed to a long string of burglaries in Harlem, the Bronx and along Riverside Drive. Jones was quoted as offering to show the detectives just how easy his chosen work was.

Jones and Lightburn were arrested on the complaint of Charles W. White, of 6 West One Hundred and Thirty-third street. White's room was broken into some time last night and a suitcase, several dollars' worth of clothing and a few pieces of silver were stolen.

Patrolman John Montayne has been the two negroes carrying the suitcases into the basement at One Hundred and Thirty-third street and Fifth avenue earlier in the morning, and when White's complaint came in he went to the place and arrested the pair.
