

## Celebration of Fiftieth Anniversary of Battle will be Notable

Occasion.

New York, June 23 .- Forty thousand reterans of the war between the North poor, suffering women, and them know the good it wo and South will be encamped next week on the field at Gettysburg, the scene of the greatest battle of that struggle. 


