TWO PRIZE ORATIONS.

All That Remain of the Many Works of Elijah Kellogg.

Generation after generation of our American schoolboys have decried "Spartacus the Gladiators" or "Regulus to the Carthaginians" and probably never stopped to wonder what stenographer among the ancients took down these celebrated remarks. As a matter of fact, both were the work of a New England clergyman, Elijah Kellogg. "Spartacus" was written while he was a young theological student at Andover in 1842 for the rhetorical exercises of his class. "Regulus" was written three years later for a fellow student to speak in a prize competition.

What college youth of these days could write such forceful orations? These have never been surpassed, and in some schools it has become necessary to bar them from the list of prize speaking competitions, so invariably do they carry off the prizes.

Of all the work of Elijah Kellogg these alone remain known. Yet he wrote thirty wholesome books for boys, some of them tales of the woods and some of school, and was for years an eloquent pastor at the Seaman's church in Boston. He might have become a Talmage or a Beecher or a Brooks and gained fame in a more fashionable pulpit, but clung to the life work he had chosen.—Detroit Free Press.

CURIOUS ALASKAN BIRDS.

Male Ptarmigans Woo in Two Tongues and Bully Their Mates.

The ptarmigan, an Alaskan bird, is a wonderful imitator of man, if Belmore Browne, who contributes an article on Alaskan game to *Outing*, is to be believed. To begin with, the author finds that the ptarmigan is a linguist of no mean ability. The male does his wooing in mixed French and English: "A pleasing side of their mating is the habit of the males of uttering their call while on the wing. They commence with a guttural cackle, which they utter faster and faster until they alight, when they end their song by repeating slowly a call that sounds like ged-up, ged-up, ged-up, ged-up or pariez vous? pariez vous? pariez vous? as they strut proudly about."

In addition to singing in two languages, the ptarmigan conducts his personal and domestic affairs in approved fashion. Could not the following observation apply to human beings as well as to this remarkable bird: "The males fight constantly, and the hens seem to enjoy these battles and sit about clucking among themselves." "But once a hen has decided on a mate she comes into her own share of troubles and is beaten and bullied by the mate she has promised to love and obey."

FIREMEN GATHER AT WILMINGTON

Twenty-Sixth Annual Convention
And Tournament To Be
Held This Week.

CITY IS IN GALA ATTIRE

New Bern Sends Four Hose Wagon
Teams To Enter Con-
tests.

Volunteer fire fighters from all over this State will gather in Wilmington this week to attend the twenty-sixth annual convention and inter-state tournament of the North Carolina Firemen's Association which will be held there from August 12 to 15.

For weeks the citizens of Wilmington have been making preparations and everything is now in readiness. The city has been decorated in an appropriate manner and according to all reports is in gala attire throughout. The firemen will be shown every attention and everything possible will be done to make their visit an enjoyable one.

New Bern will perhaps be better represented than any other city in the State. Four hose wagon teams, the Atlantic, Fourth Ward, "Button" and Riverside companies each sending a team to participate in the State hose wagon contest. The "Button" company's horse was taken to Wilmington last Thursday so that he would have an opportunity of resting up before the races, and the Atlantic horse and driver went over yesterday. The other two horses and wagons will leave to-morrow.

Wednesday will be the "big day" and the citizens of New Bern are more interested in the events of that day than those which will take place on any other during the week.
