ADVENTISTS WILL HOLD SESSION

GATHER AT GREENSBORO FOR A MEETING WHICH WILL LAST FOR TEN DAYS.

Greensboro, Aug. 19.—The eleventh annual conference and camp meeting of the North Carolina conference of Seven Day Adventists will begin a ten day session here Thursday morning, Aug. 21, in a city of tents, at which delegates will be in attendance from all parts of North Carolina. The big encampment has been in process of erection for the last week and is now in readiness for the first arrivals. The conference will remain in session until Sunday, Aug. 31.
Delegates from all of the Seventh Day Adventist churches in the State have been elected to this meeting on the basis of one delegate to every ten members of the congregation. The largest delegations will come from Asheville, Greensboro, Archdale, Albemarle, Baker Mountain, Banner Elk, Cleveland, Eufola, Hildebran, Kernersville, Naples, Valley Crucis and Wilmington. Others will come from widely separated places through the State.

A large number of family tents have been pitched in which the delegates and visitors will live during the encampment. A dining and grocery tent will supply all the provisions for the ten day session. The young people will have their own assembly tent, there will be a book tent, in addition to the great canvas pavilion in which all of the preaching services and the business sessions of the conference will be held.

All of the ordained and licensed ministers, Bible teachers, the church school teachers and the other laborers in the conference will be in attendance at this meeting, as well as several leading ministers and lecturers from various parts of the country. Among the leading speakers from outside the conference will be Elder O. Montgomery, of Atlanta, the president of the Southeastern Union conference which includes Florida, Georgia, North and South Carolina, and the Eastern half of Tennessee; W. H. Williams, of Atlanta, the secretary-treasurer of the Southeastern Union conference; Prof. H. M. Hiatt, of Boston, the secretary of the educational department of the Southeastern Union conference; V. O. Cole, of Atlanta, the superintendent of colporteurs of the Southeastern Union conference; Prof. C. L. Stone, of Graysville, Tenn., the principal of the Southern training school; L. D. Randall, of Atlanta, the manager of the Southern Publishing association and Evangelist Carlyle B. Haynes of Atlanta, a lecturer of the American Religious Liberty Association and the Anti-Cigarette League.

Postmaster J. S. Basnight is making an improvement at his home on Pollock street by having a concrete walk and concrete steps laid in front of the building.
On and after Aug. 21, the Atlantic Coast Line train leaving here at 3.10 p. m. will take mail for Jacksonville, but not for any other point.
