The following Farm Life School Bonds, given in lieu of the First Township School Bonds, were received, by the Board, and delivered to B. B. Hurst, Treasurer of Craven county. These bonds are numbered from one to ten inclusive, the denominations of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) were sold, to F. M. Hahn, J. L. Hahn, Walter B. Solinger and S. M. Strasburger, Trustees for Mamie Feder, at par, of ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars.

County of Craven,
Farm Life School Bonds.
Know all men by these presents, that the county of Craven, in the State of North Carolina, is justly indebted and, for value received, hereby promises to pay J. L. Hahn, G. M. Hahn, Walter B. Solinger and S. M. Strasburger, Trustees for Mamie Feder, on the First day of August, A. D. 1843, or at any time after August 1, 1917, at the option of the said County, the principal sum of One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) with interest there on at the rate of Five per cent. per annum, payable semi annually on the first day of August and of February each year, upon presentation and surrender of the annexed coupons as they severally become due; both principal and interest hereof are payable at the banking house of the Peoples Bank, in New Bern N. C.

This Bond is one of a series of ten bonds, numbered one (1) to ten (10), inclusive, of like date, tenor and amount aggregating ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), being a part of a total authorized issue of twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) issued for the purpose of establishing and equipping a County Farm Life School in and for said county under the provisions of Chapter 84 of the Public Laws of North Carolina of 1911, and authorized by a majority of the qualified voters of said county voting at an election legally called and held for that purpose on May 2nd, 1911, and pursuant to orders and resolutions of the County Commissioners duly passed for that purpose, said special election and the issuance of a series of bonds of which this bond for a part, were duly legalized and validated by an Act of the Legislature of North Carolina, ratified January 27th, 1913.

It is hereby recited and certified, that all acts conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this bond have been legally had, done, and performed, and that the total indebtedness of the said county of Craven, including the amount of this bond, does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation thereon. For the prompt payment hereof, both principal and interest, the full faith, credit and resources of said Craven county are hereby irrevocably pledged.

In witness whereof, the Board of County Commissioners of Craven county, North Carolina, has caused this bond to be signed by its chairman and attested by its Clerk, with the seal of the county affixed hereto, and the interest coupons hereto attached to be signed with the lithographed facsimile signatures of the said Chairman and the clerk, all as of date the first day of August, A. D. 1913.

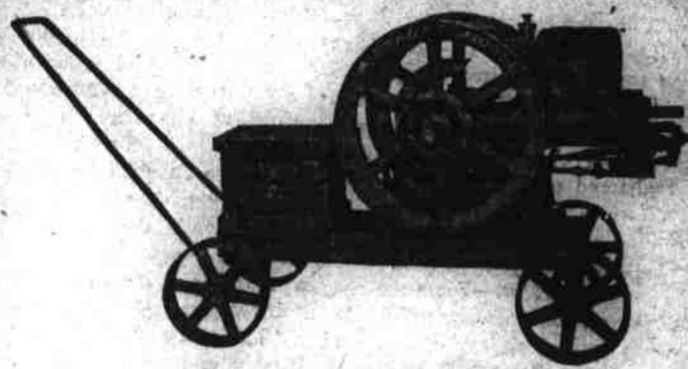

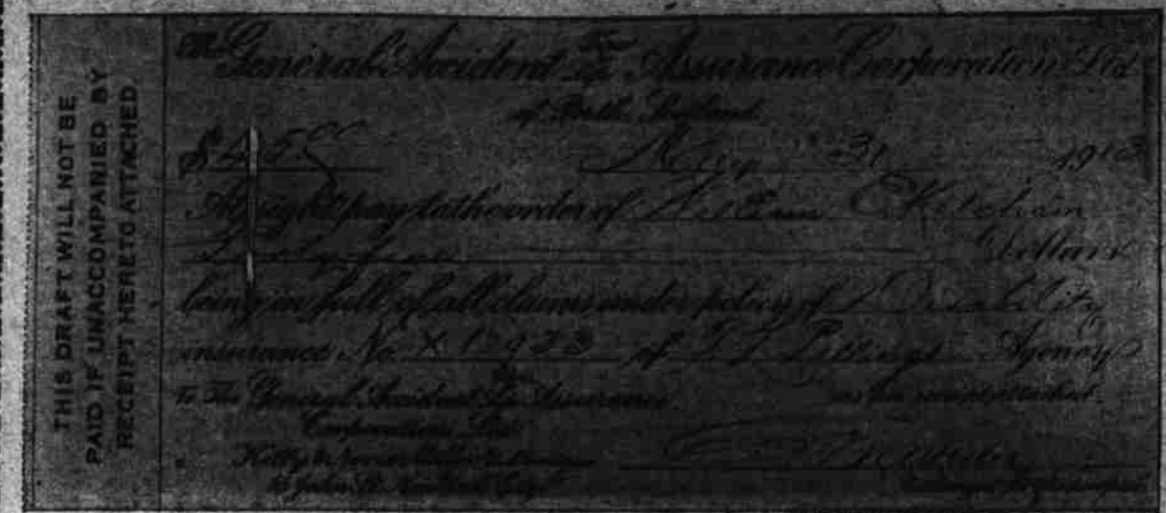
