CHAMBER OF COMMERCE PLANS FOR ANNUAL GET TOGETHER MEETING.

Bonner; pastors, Rev. B. F. Huske; bankers, W. W. Griffin; manufacturers, Clyde Eby; farm development, Munroe Howell; educators, S. M. Brinson; general business, T. A. Green; County, C. D. Bradham; Chamber of Commerce, in the absence of President Hyman first vice-president B. B. Hurst will make the address. M. D. W. Steverson will act as toastmaster.

A committee composed of W. W. Griffin and Jesse Claypoole were appointed to make all necessary arrangements for the dinner. This event will be elaborate in every detail and nothing will be left undone which will in any way help to make it a complete success.
