TWO THOUSAND AND ELEVEN SENT OUT FROM APRIL FIR-ST TO FIFTEENTH.

The parcel Post department of the United States Mail, is not only a great try, but is a paying proposition for the than thirty days. government. The parcel post is yet in its infancy, being just a little over a year old, but the number of packages shipped by this method is surprisingly large, and continues to grow larger. There were two thousand and eleven packages mailed at the New Bern post office during the first fifteen days of this month, the amount of postage required for the transportation of these packages was \$162.25. The two thousand packages do not include those mailed to New Bern from other towns, it includes only those mailed at the al Post Office.

Many people, when they try the parcel post the first time, express as-tonishment at the low rates. For instance, packages not exceeding four ounces in weight can be sent any where regardless of district, at one cent per ounce. Heavier packages in the local tone are five cents for the first pound and one cent for each additional two the Sun, the Best pounds; in the first and second zones, radius of 150 miles, five cents or the first pound and one cent for each additional pound; in the third zone, 300 two cents for each additional pound, in the first each additional pound, the fourth zone, 600 miles, seven ents for the first pound and four cents for each additional pound; in the fifth one 1000 miles, eight cents for the first bound and six cents for each additionpound; in the sixth zone, 1,400 miles, duck's back. nine cents for the first pound and seven cents for each additional pound; in the eventh zone, (-) miles, eleven cents for the first pound and ten cents for each addittional pound; in the eighth one including all United States posessions twelve cents a pound.

Packages ar insured up to \$25 in alue for an additional fee of five cents to \$50 for ten cents. Package, can sent C. O. D. by adding a fee of ten ents to the postage, this fee also covring ins rance.

Packag s weighing as much as five counds are accepted for the first and econd zores, while the weight is limted to twenty pounds to all other zones. The privilege has also been extended to embrace in merous articles hat at first were restricted from these low rates.
