#### Punishment Meted Out To Norfolk Bookkeeper.

NORFOLK, April 24.-Tried in the Corporation Court upon an indictment charging grand larceny G. A. Heptinstall, formerly employed as a bookkeeper for Smith and McCoy, shipbuilders, was convicted yesterday and his punishment fixed at one year in the State penitentiary.

Heptinstall was accused of embezzling \$5,900 belonging to Smith and McCoy while he was employed as bookkeeper for that concern and having charge of the cash. His speculations, it was charged, extended over a period of several years. He is a native of Washington, N. C.

The defandant was represented by Attorneys James G. Martin and Thomas H. Willcox. He was prosecuted by Common ealth's Attorney Shackleford and Paul Kear.
