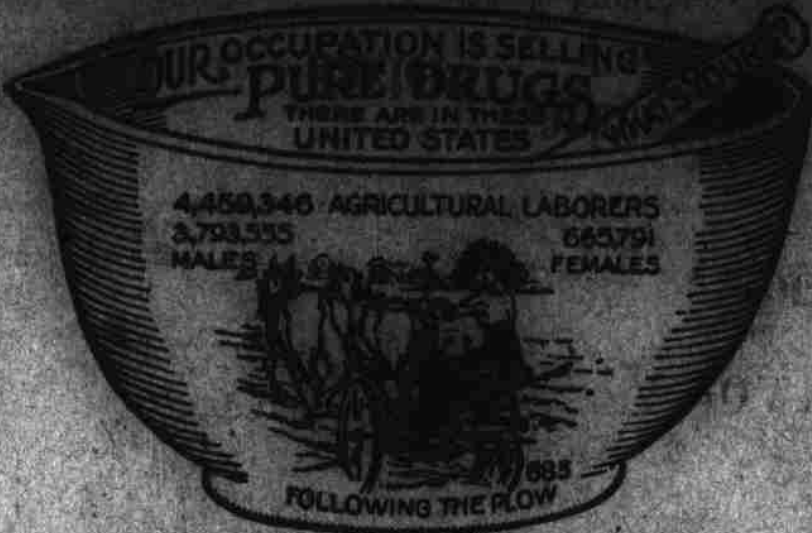
Sketch of William Gibbs McAdoo.
William Gibbs McAdoo first became a national character when he pushed to successful completion the project to build a rapid transit tunnel under the Hudson river from Manhattan to Hoboken. It was thirteen years ago that he organized the New York and New Jersey Railroad Company. One of the greatest feats in engineering history was an accomplished fact in six years.

His political prominence came with Mr. Wilson's campaign for president. Mr. McAdoo had been much interested in the stalwart Governor of New Jersey and was one of the few who declared for Mr. Wilson when a personal poll of the New York delegation was taken at the Baltimore Convention. After Mr. Wilson had been nominated, Mr. McAdoo was made chairman of the Democratic National Committee and because of the illness of Mr. McCoombs was called upon to take charge of the campaign.

Mr. McAdoo was born in Georgia in 1863, of a family which had been wealthy but had lost all in the Civil War. At twenty-one young McAdoo was admitted to the bar and five years later he came to New York. Here he formed a partnership with William McAdoo, who was no known relation. The latter has been Assistant Secretary of the Navy under Cleveland Police Commissioner and Chief Magistrate of New York.

In 1885 Mr. McAdoo married Miss Sarah Fleming, of Chattanooga, Tenn., who died four years ago. There are six children, Mrs. Charles Martin, of Prescott, Ariz., Francis Huger McAdoo (who married Miss Hazel McCormack last summer) Nona McAdoo, Robert Hazelhurst McAdoo, Sallie McAdoo, and William G. McAdoo, Jr., Mr. and Mrs. Martin have presented Mr. McAdoo with a grandchild.

Mr. McAdoo's principal residence is at Irvington-on-the-Hudson, not far from New York. Miss Nona McAdoo and her new mother are fast friends and are often seen together about the Capitol.

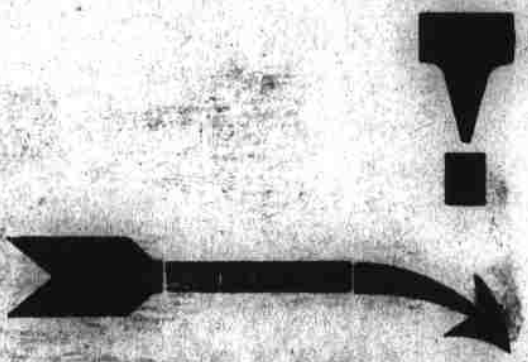

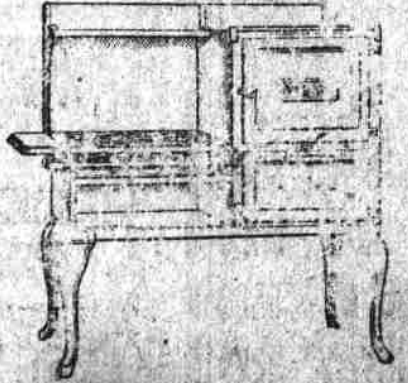
