The need of a safe was not realized ntil today, and on account of the fact of remaining open all of the time with ome one on duty it has been found practicable to keep the money under lock and key in a desk drawer.

Manager John Leludis, left the cafe hortly after midnight, after making up the bank deposit for the morning, and slipping it into a desk drawer, went to his room for the night. During the night, while Mike Junigan was on duty in the case, some one manipulated a key to the drawer, evidently while he was at the task of preparing an order in the kitchen, and the fact was discovered that the drawer was unlocked, and the cigar box containing the checks and noney was gone.

The matter has been reported to the police, who are much at a loss on account of the continuous trade all night in these cafes, and the fact that little or no attention was paid to it.


