#### UPLAND CORN RUINED.

Drought in Greenville County, S. C. Is Severe.

(Special to the Journal.)  
GREENVILLE, S. C., May 29.—From all sections of the county come reports of serious damage from the drought which has continued practically unbroken since April 12. Upland corn is ruined, and will have to be replanted. Cotton is suffering greatly, and truck patches are drying up.

The fruit crop seems to be the only thing yet uninjured.

#### ALL-NIGHT CAFE ROBBED.

The Busy Bee of Rocky Mount Is Short \$360.

ROCKY MOUNT, May 29.—Sometime after 1 o'clock yesterday morning some one robbed the all-night cafe—the Busy Bee—of \$360 in checks and cash, which represented the receipt awaiting deposit.

The need of a safe was not realized until today, and on account of the fact of remaining open all of the time with some one on duty it has been found practicable to keep the money under lock and key in a desk drawer.

Manager John Leludis, left the cafe shortly after midnight, after making up the bank deposit for the morning, and slipping it into a desk drawer, went to his room for the night. During the night, while Mike Junigan was on duty in the cafe, some one manipulated a key to the drawer, evidently while he was at the task of preparing an order in the kitchen, and the fact was discovered that the drawer was unlocked, and the cigar box containing the checks and money was gone.

The matter has been reported to the police, who are much at a loss on account of the continuous trade all night in these cafes, and the fact that little or no attention was paid to it.

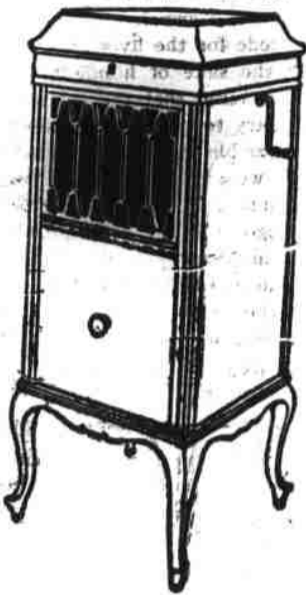

The teachers will carry with them bed linen and towels. Medals will be furnished the teachers in the dining room of the Farm-life School.

There will be no charge for tuition. The only expense will be the \$4.00 per week for room and board in the dormitory.

For other information, address Dr. J. E. Turlinton, Vanceboro. The law governing Institution will be observed and all teachers are urged to be present the first day and continue in attendance the full three weeks.

The Pamlico County teachers are expected to join with us in this school.
