

General Execution Of The WERE CAPTURED

Appeal of General Howard in the Name of Humanity of No Avail -Lives of Garrison Saved

(Special to the Journal) NOGALES, /.RIZ., May 29.-Thirty-five Federal ficers captured by the Constitutionalities at Tepic were ex-ecuted May 24, according to a message received here today from Gen. Alvaro Obregon, the Constitutionalist com-

mander. General Obregon's message says Rear Admiral Howard, American na-val commander on the Pacific Coast, telegraphed to the German consul at Tepic to intercede for the lives of the Federals "for the sake of humanity" but Obregon answered that the execution was necessary to prevent the of-ficers making trouble in the future.

Reports of the execution of General Munoz, nephew of ex-President Porfiro Diaz, General Orzono and nine colonels seem well established. The men shot, it was said, reiterated their royalty, to the Huerta government and gave their lives rather than violate their oath of allegiance.

Twelve members of a federal mili-tary band were shot by Constitutionalists soldiers without sanction of their officers.

General Alvarez, one of the Federal commanders, met his death in an unusual manner. After defeat had become certain, he crawled into a water tank of a train. He was killed when two hand grenades were thrown into

Another Federal officer, Col. Ernest Jano Hernandez, shot himdelf through he head. General IllGlulalridiflolo though wounded escaped. The wounded Federals were taken in charge by Villa's hospital corps and still are alive Among them is a lieutenant colonel, several majors and captains. In the past such officers have not been spared.
