The recess meeti 15 of the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern, was held Friday, May 14th, 1914, at eight clock p. m.

L. M. Satterthwaite. In reference to the Sunday Observance Ordinance, Alderman Ellis moved that a night be set aside especially for the purpose of settling this matter, and that, no other business be transacted at said meeting; the night to be agreed upon by the Ordinance & License Committee, City Attorney, and the Ministerial Committee, and when agreed A Manufacturer upon that a notice be inserted in both A Doctor or the daily papers as to the night, hour,

Alderman Satterthwaite seconded the notion. Motion carried.

Mr. John Guion, Attorney, appeared before the Board in behalf of the owners of the property on east Front Street in the vicinity of the still yard, and F. S Duffy lot, stating that the owners were desirous of improving said property and requested that the Board appoint a Committee to meet with the owners in reference to the laying of sidewalks, sewer and water pipes.

Alderman Satterthwaite, moved that the matter be referred to the Streets and Pumps Committee.

Alderman Hall, seconded the moion. Motion carried.

Mr. J. Leon Williams, appeared beore the Board and requested the city to grant him the privilege of placing a banner across the street by the Union Station, and in front of the office having charge of the Home Coming Week.

Alderman Blades moved that the equest be granted.

Motion seconded, and carried. Alderman Ellis, moved that all couons, notes and papers of all description hat are paid during the month be cancelled at the next regular meeting folowing payment, in the presence of the


