IMPRESSIVE services marked the arrival in New York of the bodies of seventeen bluejackets and marines killed in the capture of Vera Cruz. President Wilson visited the Brooklyn navy yard the day the flag draped coffins arrived and delivered an address in honor of the heroic dead. There was military and naval pomp. There were blazes of color from uniforms, flags, gold braid and flowers. There was solemn music from bands and from school chorus. There were the crash of rifle volleys, the sad notes of a final bugle farewell. The illustration shows the funeral cortege crossing the Manhattan bridge which spans the East river from Manhattan to Brooklyn.
