ARRESTED ON CHARGE OF BURNING STORE

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT PROSECUTES WINSTON MEN

RALEIGH, June 24.—Commissioner James R. Young, of the State Department of Insurance, was notified today by Deputy Commissioner of Insurance W. A. Scott from Winston-Salem that he has procured the arrest there of two men charged with the burning of a corner grocery store they operated in a suburb of the Twin City. They are K. L. Cobler and T. B. Owen. Mr. Scott also advised the commissioner of insurance that he has retained ex-Judge E. B. Jones to prosecute the two men in the preliminary hearings. The charge is burning the store for the insurance.

Drug Company Chartered
A charter of issue for the Waldo Drug Company, of Cary, Wake county, capital \$25,000 authorized and \$700 subscribed by Dr. J. M. Templeton and others. There is also an amendment for the charter of the Farmers Bank & Trust Co., of Cherrylville, to extend the scope of the business that the corporation can do. M. L. Croft is one of the number of incorporators.

Institute for Institute Workers
Announcement is made by Capt. T. B. Parker, director of the farmers' institute division of the State Department of Agriculture, that he will hold a special institute here July 21 to 23 for the institute workers who will spend the summer in special institute work under his direction. He has arranged for this institute work for the farmers to begin July 24 and be carried on right along in the western counties as far west as the crest of the Blue Ridge until August 22. Then there will be a short recess and then institute work will be carried beyond the Blue Ridge during the month of September. Captain Parker is much pleased with the outlook for the institute work this summer.
