## MONTHLY REPORT OF MEAT AND MILK INSPECTOR.

New Bern, N. C., July 7 1914.  
To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern, New Bern, N. C., Gentlemen:

I have the honor of submitting my report for the month of June as follows:

We will first take the condition of the dairies for this month.

I have made inspection of the dairies and think that they are doing as well as could be expected. All seem to be trying to keep their dairies and dairy barns in as good condition as possible.

I wish to state that the new dairy which will be known as the White House Dairy, I think will be one of the nicest in the State. This dairy will be owned and operated by Mr. Maine, who is an experienced man in the business. I don't know at what time he will open his place but I think it will be in a few days now as it is almost completed and I see no reason why the White House Dairy will not be entitled to a perfect score.

I am very sorry that I am not able to obtain the tuberculin to finish the tests, just as soon as the State furnishes me with this I will finish the tests.

## CITY ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern: That Chapter 13 of the ordinances of the city of New Bern be amended by striking out Section 3 thereof and, in lieu thereof, inserting the following:

Sec. 3. "Any person, firm or corporation who shall keep open any store or shop on Sunday for the purpose of buying, selling and transacting business except in cases of necessity, shall upon conviction, pay a fine of ten dollars for each and every offense.

"But drug stores and apothecary shops may be kept open at all times for the sale of drugs and medicines, toilet articles and soaps, and such other merchandise as may be necessary in case of sickness or accident; provided this ordinance shall not apply to the sale of milk or ice at any time nor to the delivery of ice cream prior to 10:45 o'clock a. m.

"Provided further, that it shall be a violation of this ordinance to sell Coca-Cola, Pepsi-Cola, or other soft drinks by whatever name called, or ice cream, cigars, cigarettes or tobacco except by hotels and bona fide restaurants in their places of business and in the ordinary conduct of their business."
