## CHAMPION FISH STORY WAS TOLD YESTERDAY

### GOOSE CREEK ISLANDER MAKING QUEER USE OF BIG SHARK.

A number of stories which might be classed as "nature fakes" have recently been heard in New Bern, but in each case the narrator of the tales was a person of repute and whose word is known to be good. First there was little Johnnie Hanson, of Bridgeton who watched the sun's rays hatch a chicken. Next came R. L. Stallings of Bridgeton with an account of an eight month old calf, which was giving milk. Next in order Mr. Wadley of the Bradham Broad street drug store finds a perfectly formed egg inside of a hen's egg, but it remained for an old sea captain, Frank Sloan, of Goose Creek Island, away down on the nethermost end of the North Carolina coast, to cap the climax with a fish story that is "some" yarn.

The Captain was in New Bern yesterday, and while here the conversation drifted around to curiosities. One man told about the chicken, another about the calf, etc., and finally the visitor stated that he knew of a case which had the others left in the shade. According to the captain's yarn, he several months ago succeeded in catching a small shark. The fish was not of the man eating variety, and the captain decided to make an attempt to keep him alive.

He finally succeeded in getting it into an inclosure which he had built in the water and at once devised a plan to make the fish, which at present is about five feet in length, serve as a motor for a small boat by placing it in a wire cage beneath the craft. The old mariner has not yet succeeded in accomplishing this object, but holds out hopes of doing so, and in fact says that the fish, he believes understands his motives, and is aiding him as much as possible. The Captain is known to be a truthful man and his account of this strange incident is given credence.
