ORDINANCE.

Alderman Ellis moved the adoption of the following ordinance:

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the city of New Bern: Section 1. That chapter 4 of the ordinances of the city be amended by adding at the end of thereof the following:

Sec. 40. All railroad companies maintaining a track or tracks across any street in the city shall between the rails of and on each side of such track or tracks either pave the width of such street or lay plank thereon in such manner as to permit vehicles to cross without difficulty or excessive jolting. Whoever violates this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined ten dollars; and each day such track or tracks shall be maintained in violation thereof shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.

Alderman Dawson, seconded the motion and upon vote of the Board the resolution was adopted.
