

# Watermelon Season Now at Its Height

THOUSANDS JUICY PRODUCTS OF THE SOIL BEING SOLD IN NEW BERN.

The watermelon season in Eastern North Carolina is now at height, and thousands of these juicy products of the soil are being brought to New Bern each day and disposed of to the local dealers. Not only are large quantities of the melons being sold right here in the city, but many are being shipped North several car loads being sent away each week. The present season has been an unusually good one for the melon growers, and as the prices paid for them have been good, the growers have some money on the crop, and will make more before it comes to a class. The cantaloupe crop has also been unusually large, and the quality of the majority of those seen here is considerably better than usual. But few cantaloupes, however, are now seen on the market, the season having practically come to a close.

## TELLS HIS PEOPLE NOT TO MAKE HIM GIFTS.

Request Of Ludwig Of Bavaria Not Heeded By People, However.

MUNCH, BAVARIA, August 10.—Some time ago King Ludwig III of Bavaria caused it to be known that he did not wish to receive any valuable presents on any occasion.

This statement did not, however, appear to have the desired effect, as quite recently it was announced that the sum of 120,000 marks was required for the purpose of purchasing a centerpiece to be presented to the King, and a collection was started in Bavarian towns.

The King, who came to hear of this proposal, thereupon caused the Bavarian minister for home affairs to issue an edict to all presents of provincial councils, calling upon them to prevent all communities and private persons from offering gifts to his majesty, as otherwise they would be acting in direct opposition to his desires and he naturally wished to be spared the unpleasant necessity of having personally to refuse these gifts.
