**ELECTION OF POPE
SEPTEMBER 3RD**

**SACRED COLLEGE YESTERDAY
ARRANGED FOR AN EL-
ABORATE FUNERAL**

Rome, Aug. 20.—It is expected the
conclave for the election of a pope
will be held on September 3, after a
delay to give time for the cardinals
from several countries to arrive.
Even so, it is doubtful whether Car-
dinals Gibbons and O'Connell from
the United States and Cardinal Cav-
alcanti from Rio Janeiro can reach
here by that time, owing to the par-
tial suspension of the steamship ser-
vice.

It is stated that notwithstanding
the war, special trains will be put at
the disposal of the cardinals in Eu-
rope.

The rising sun which gilded the
image of St. Joseph on the wall by
the pontiff bed this morning found
the Franciscan Plenipotentiaries keep-
ing the dead watch and murmuring
prayers. At St. Peter's Square which
had been filled throughout the night
with persons of every rank until the
death of the Pope was announced
was deserted. Under the colonades
at the bronze door of the Vatican two
Italian Carabinieri exchanged re-
ports regarding the death of his holiness
with the Swiss guards.

Mosignor Zampini, of the Pope's
household, assisted by the secretary
and the Pontiff's valet, laid out the
body, placed the crucifix in the hands
and stationed lighted candles about
the bed.

It so happened that Cardinal Della
Volpe, the chamberlain; Serafino
Vaunutelli, dean of the sacred Col-
lege, and Antonio Agliardi, chancel-
lor of the Holy Roman Church, all
were absent from Rome. It was an-
nounced that Cardinal Della Volpe
would return today and immediately
upon his arrival invite the members
of the Sacred College to decide upon
the funeral ceremonies, which will
occupy nine days.

**SALVATION ARMY TO LOCATE
AT KINSTON.**

KINSTON, Aug. 20.—Envoy James
Sharpe of Charlotte and other officers
of the Salvation Army are here today
to ascertain the advisability of estab-
lishing an outpost of the army at Kin-
ston. Their report will depend largely
upon whether adequate quarters can
be secured. Kinston is now subsidiary
to the post at New Bern, but if a garri-
son is located here, will become an
independent post, with jurisdiction
over a good bit of the surrounding coun-
try.

**RUSSIAN REFUGEES FROM GER-
MANY.**

STOCKHOLM, Aug. 20.—Fully fif-
teen thousand Russian refugees from
Germany most of them exhausted, fam-
ished and sick, have gone through
Stockholm since the beginning of the
war. From fifteen hundred to two
thousand arrive daily. They included
wealthy women in furs and diamonds
and poor women in rags with half
naked children in their arms.

**SPAIN'S ATTITUDE TO BE MADE
KNOWN.**

MADRID, Aug. 20.—King Alfonso
accompanied by Premier Dato, has
returned from San Sebastian and will
have an important conference with
the French and English Ambassadors
in regard to Spain's attitude toward
the European conflict, it is stated.

**CALLS FOR RELIEF FUND FOR
BELGIUM.**

JACKSON, Miss., Aug. 20.—Bishop
Lambuth of the Methodist Church
South, has issued an appeal to South-
ern Methodists for a fund of at least
one thousand dollars to be sent to
the Queen of Belgium, for relief of
the sick and wounded soldiers.

WARREN ON THE JOB.

State Chairman Arrives at Raleigh
And Gets Busy.

RALEIGH, Aug. 20.—Democratic
State Chairman Thos. D. Warren is
here from New Bern conferring with
state officers and party leaders with
reference to the campaign and is pre-
paring to open Democratic headquarters
here early in September. He is having
rooms for this purpose equipped in
the Yarborough hotel. Chairman
Warren expressed himself as well
pleased with the outlook over the state
and feels that the differences in the
tenth Congressional engendered as a re-
sult of the Gudgey Reynolds contest
for Congress will be completed harmo-
nized and that the Democrats through-
out the state will present a united front
for a great victory in November.
