REMARKABLE ESCAPES.

Macon, Ga., Dentist and His Wife in
Muelhausen During Fighting

BERLIN, August 22.—Via Copen-
hagen and London, 4—Four
Americans, two men and two women,
to-day reported their remarkable ex-
cape from death at Muelhausen, where
they were during the fighting.

They are Edward Walker, a dentist,
of Macon, Ga., and his wife and a Mr.
and Mrs. Cade, whose home address
cannot be ascertained. Mr. Cade also
is a dentist.

They were caught at Muelhausen at
the beginning of the fighting, and had
to remain several days amidst a hail
of projectiles. They are now safe at
Glatterbade in the Black forest, whither
they walked from Muelhausen.

A letter from one of the quarter,
which has been brought to Berlin, says
the uninterrupted fighting and the fire
of artillery never will be forgotten.

**CONSIDERABLE STREET IM-
PROVEMENTS GOING
